## FSC®

The Forest Stewardship Council (FSC®) is an international, non-governmental organisation dedicated to promoting responsible management of the world's forests.

A large number of our products involve the use of timber in their construction.

We use a variety of timber such as MDF (medium density fibreboard), solid beech and solid oak, this timber has always been procured from sustainable sources but we are now using an increased percentage of FSC® certified timber as standard. This provides assurance to our clients that the timber we use comes from the most responsible suppliers.

A large proportion of our table tops are supplied with FSC® as standard, look for the tree 🛊 icon on individual product pages.

#### CHAIN OF CUSTODY

Chain of custody certification is how the FSC® verifies that forest-based materials produced according to their standards are credibly used along the product's path, from the forest to becoming finished goods. The FSC® logo on a finished product signals that the materials used during production have met the chain of custody requirements at every step in the supply chain, from sourcing to distribution.

### **FISP**

FISP is an independently certified sustainability programme created to tailor to the needs of the Furniture Industry supply chain.
